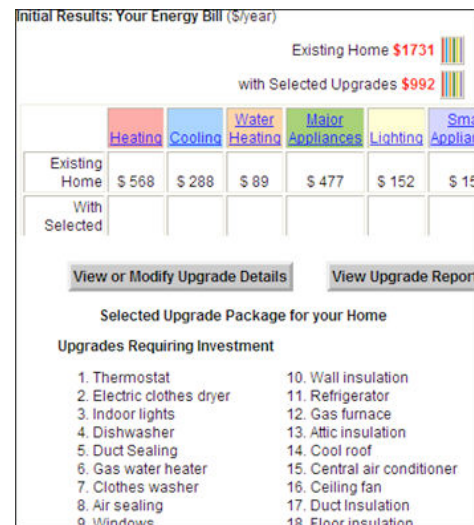
Save Energy: Unplug Your Cell Charger (and more)
